This edition of Haspire ensures that children are multitasking, efficient and have ample of capacity to achieve their goal.



IN COMPUTER







APJ Abdul Kalam the general wizard of science always walked very fast, his speech came in an excited patter of never-ending ideas and he constantly spoke of igniting young minds to the joys of science. Today as a tribute to the memory of the former president, maybe it's time for us to restore science to the lives of the young, science as the magical mystery tour Kalam wanted it to be.

Kalam's vision was not of science as a forbidding super elite of scientists cloistered in the lofty environs of DRDO, TIFR and CSIR, but science as a reality in the daily lives of kids. In the land of Meghnad Saha, Vikram Sarabhai and Homi Bhabha how many Indian kids have access to excellent science teaching, equipment, labs or technological parks that can make them enthusiasts of science? Why is it that all India's post-independence Nobel laureates in science, Har Gobind Khorana, S Chandrasekhar and Venkatraman Ramakrishnan, worked in UK and US and took citizenship in those countries?





Jai Jawan, Jai Kisan, Jai Vigyan was the slogan of nation builders but there is little jai in Indian science.

Kalam stood for the democratization of science, for physics not as a frightening monolith bearing down on IIT aspirants, but a playful adventure for kids. If science is seen as star wars, then Kalam was gentlest Yoda.

Yet Indian science today has been described as "ivory towers of excellence in a sea of mediocrity". A few years ago then PM Manmohan Singh spoke about the need to break the bureaucratic shackles in Indian science. When scientists get little respect in society, when pure science as a career takes a back seat to MBAs, when scientists are forced to seek political patronage for funding and opportunities, no wonder we have become a country where as Narayana Murthy said recently there has been no earth shaking idea or invention for the last 60 years. If science teachers are like professor virus, no wonder no science student can sing "all izz well".

The best scientific minds may go to DRDO and CISR but how many of them take classes in colleges? Kalam stood for breaking the walls that separate top scientist from children. To awaken the chutzpah of chemistry and the passion in physics, let's think of the science of Kalam: a top scientist who shunned elitism and instead constantly interacted with students, for whom the science of daily living was the art of progress.
